

# UNIT 4 ENDANGERED ANIMALS

The delicate little animal that you see here is a bilby—our largest bandicoot. It is about the size of a cat, has a very long tail, and three toes with long claws on each forepaw. These are used for digging burrows, which are sometimes as deep as 2 metres.

Bilbies were once found in most of Southern Australia, but now they live only in desert areas of Central Australia.

Rabbits have taken over their burrows, cattle have eaten the vegetation and destroyed their homes, and they are hunted by foxes.

These three animals, all introduced from other countries, have put our native bilby on the endangered list.


